Mr. Landon provided a brief overview to this item.

CM McGuire-What is the total balance due for nuisance? Ans: Mr. Quinn-The initial amount was just over \$200K and has decreased since the initial roll.

Public Comments:

Louis McCarthy-Does this include lien holders? What is the priority of this lien? Ms. Costa-Is there an assessment code due on 2014, if there was a tax deed in 2011? Should that amount be included in the tax deed?

Responses to public comments:

Lien holders-Attorney Reischmann-The lien attaches against the ownership of the property, the owner will lose the property if the owner does not pay the ad-valorem taxes or non-ad valorem taxes-this process is to go on the taxes for the nuisance abatement, the services that the City provided but did not get paid. This is included on their tax bill. Mayor Netts-There is a priority of liens; 1. Property taxes-property taxes get paid first, if there is any money left over after the sale of the house, then the first mortgage holder gets whatever is left over, if there is still money left over, so on and so forth. The problem with typical code enforcement, you may put a lien on the property but if there is a house with a value of \$200K with \$100K mortgage, during the recession, the value of the house dropped to \$100K, there is no money left in the profit of the sale, straight code enforcement your lien would not be satisfied but in this case, the property tax and these liens are the first priority. It is the most secure way that the tax payers are not subsidizing someone else's maintenance and repair.

Tax deed-Attorney Reischmann-If there was a nuisance abatement lien placed in 2011 along with the property taxes; it would be treated identical as the unpaid 2011 taxes. If the property owner failed to pay the tax certificate issued in 2011 and sufficient time passed after notice to the property owner of a tax sale, of the tax certificate, then a tax deed would be issued. It is possible, if the facts are that in 2011, the parcel had a nuisance abatement lien placed, it is possible that the property would be sold. The City would be paid; the City was paid when the tax certificate was paid by the investor.

CM Ferguson-Matanzas Woods golf club-Is it on this list? Ans: Mr. Landon-We have contacted the property owner and they have always cleaned it up to minimum standards, so no it is not on the list.

Public Comments:

Jack Carall-If I call the ambulance and I have to go to the emergency room, I see the doctor, you are going to pay him/her? I go home and receive a bill and pay for this in my taxes, too. Isn't this double dipping?

Response to Public Comments:

Director Fees-Ans: Mayor Netts-The fee that we are paying to Dr. McCabe is not for her medical practice but for her setting of the standards for the use of certain drugs by EMS personnel in the field. It is essentially a management fee for the County ambulances and the City of Palm Coast emergency medical service personnel. EMS personnel often times administer drugs, they are not physicians, so they can only administer certain drugs under the authorization of a physician, so that is what we are paying Dr. McCabe for. Also, the doctor is responsible for maintaining the standards of performance, how and when do you do the drugs, under what circumstances, etc.

Norman Weiskopf-Flagler County runs the EMS department, how does the City of Palm Coast get involved? Ans: Mayor Netts-The County operates an EMS service that is County wide, they operate all the transportation ambulances, because we are a large populous City, the City is generally the first responder (trained in EMS). Mr. Landon-All of our fire trucks are trained in emergency service but we are not transporters.

CM Ferguson-Where does the funds for this come from? Ans: Mr. Landon-General fund.

Florida Park Drive-Ans: Mayor Netts-It is a busy street, it has been looked at by our traffic engineer and we have had our commander looked into that street. Noise-we can have our traffic engineer look into if there is any excessive noise. Commander Carmen will look into any noise ordinances or state law relative to noise.

Pine Grove Belle Terre Traffic light-Ans: Mr. Landon-We will have our traffic engineer look into this. If the signal is not warranted under State law, we will look to see if other improvements are needed.
