Mr. Landon provided a brief overview to this item. *Mr.* Richard Adams and Brian Matthews presented a PowerPoint presentation, which is attached to these minutes.

CM Nobile-What is the term? Ans: Mr. Quinn-20 years.

VM McGuire-This is not something the City of Palm Coast wants to do because it is nice to do, what happens if we exceed capacity? Ans: Mr. Adams-DEP would issue a building moratorium.

VM McGuire-Will the securing of this loan result in any burden to the tax payers? Where is the money going to come from to pay it back? Ans: Mr. Quinn-There is no burden to the tax payers, this is part of the utility fund which is supported by water and sewer rates.

VM McGuire-So this is an enterprise fund? Ans: Mr. Quinn-Yes, no taxes are used for this particular fund or this particular project or the paying back of these funds. The current utility rates in place already support the debt service on this particular loan.

VM McGuire-So it is not necessary to raise utility fees at this time? Ans: Mr. Quinn-Correct.

CM Nobile-How far out do you see that, I am talking strictly in regards to the loan, not to just increases natural yearly increases? Ans: Mr. Quinn-All things being equal assuming nothing ever increased in the future, our current rates would cover the costs of the loan for the life of the loan.

CM DeLorenzo-Section 3.02 of the document, page 9 talks about the loan debt service account and how it must be invested, are we taking this is a lump or will there be drawers? Ans: Mr. Quinn-It is always drawn, it is drawn based on you spend the money first out of your current operating funds you have available and then you are reimbursed in drawers out of what you spent from the state. We typically do that on a monthly basis. The debt service account talks about the next actual loan payment, we have to make the loan payments every six months. We are required to have that 6 month loan payment in the bank ready to go before the payment is due.

Public Comments:

Jack Carall-How do you project how much money you will get in 20 years?

Responses to Public Comment:

Projections-Ans: Mr. Quinn-It works the same for a business as it does for an individual giving a mortgage. Instead of how secure is your job, the question is how secure is your revenue stream, how strong is your City as a City, how secure are the residents in the City, those are some of the very same questions asked for commercial loans and the answers are the same, you answer what you believe to be true based on your history and what you project into the future. In our case our City is very strong and has been strong, I think it will continue to be strong and that is what you based loan decisions on.

CM Nobile-The strength to be able to get a loan at .06% and 20 years, the financial institutions believe we are strong, correct? Ans: Mr. Quinn-Correct.

VM McGuire removed this item from the consent agenda.

Mr. Landon provided an overview to this item.

VM McGuire wants to see an evaluation on a regular basis to determine whether or not using public works personnel vs. a cleaning contract is the best route to take. Ans: Mr. Landon-Fully approves on that basis.

CM DeLorenzo-wants the reporting as well.

CM Nobile-I agree with VM McGuire and CM DeLorenzo on the measuring but am a little concerned as to what does that mean? We are not comparing apples to apples. Concerned with failure, what constitutes failure? Ans: Mr. Landon-If we are not able to fulfill those work orders in a timely fashion, if we are not able to keep it clean with our current staffing and we have to start adding staffing to make that happen and that amount of staffing costing us more than if we just had cleaning and we did some of the work orders ourselves, so the fact that we went out to bid to see what the private sector wants to charge us that gives us a benchmark if you will as to what it should be for the cleaning portion, that is one of the reasons we did it this way. On the other hand if we have some other facilities that we can add to this and not have them pay a

private company to do it, that is also an option in the future. It will be the performance as far as quality of work, are we getting it done and the cost of making that happen and how many employees we have to hire to make it work and compare that to the private bids we received.

CM Shipley-Would Council be aware of when an additional staff personnel is added? Ans: Mr. Landon-To add the staffing, addition employees would require City Council approval to the budget, what we may do that does not require City Council approval is shift our resources without adding personnel but actually making sure we have the right people in the right places. So as Nestor indicated we can still use our current staffing and resources and take away from something else part time that is part of the flexibility here. You would not see that, that would be something public works would just manage, I would not see that either. The other part of that and I want to stress that is our facility maintenance includes things like parks. Right now if it is not past 7:00pm-8:00pm we have somebody going around cleaning toilets, restrooms in our parks right now. That is all part of pulling those resources together and making sure, like the park facility across the lake here, that will all be tied into whoever cleans this building. So those are the kinds of things that the management at public works will be measuring.

Public Comments:

Jack Carall-What kind of contract do we have with Stockton, how does hiring more people effect the contract?

George Mayo-What is the term of the contract? Any penalties?

Responses to Public Comments:

Effects on contract-Ans: Mr. Landon-Both parties can cancel without cause with 30 days notice. The term is for 3 years with an option to extend for two-1 year terms.
