Subject PROCLAMATION OPIOID AWARENESS MONTH

Background:

The Flagler County Opioid Task Force, formed in the Spring of 2019, is charged with bringing awareness and prevention of the opioid crisis in our community and requests that the City of Palm Coast declare July as Opioid Awareness Month.

Recommended Action :

Council to proclaim July 2019 as Opioid Awareness Month.



WHEREAS, Flagler County and the State of Florida is in the midst of a public health and safety crisis caused by the opioid epidemic and characterized by an alarming rate of opioid overdose deaths; and

WHEREAS, opioid overdoses have recently claimed the lives of far too many Flagler County residents; and

WHEREAS, the National Safety Council reported on January 14, 2019 that for the first time Americans are more likely to die from an accidental opioid overdose than from a motor vehicle crash; and

WHEREAS, opioid overdoses can be prevented and lives can be saved; and

WHEREAS, we recognize that substance use disorder is a disease, that individuals with substance use disorder come from diverse backgrounds and live in every part of our State, and furthermore, that recovery from substance use disorder is possible; and

WHEREAS, the toll that substance use disorder takes on individuals, families, friends, and communities must drive us to do all that we can to reduce its impact and help Flagler County residents lead healthy, successful, and productive lives; and

WHEREAS, we must come together to build on the existing work and successful initiatives of State agencies, stakeholder coalitions, and community partners to contain the opioid epidemic; and

WHEREAS, Flagler County needs a comprehensive plan to address opioid misuse and reduce overdose deaths in our County; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Task Force is to develop, approve, and implement a comprehensive Opioid Action Plan to: (1) prevent the further spread of the opioid crisis; (2) treat and promote the recovery of individuals with opioid use disorder; and (3) respond effectively to avert opioid overdose deaths.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Palm Coast, that they hereby proclaim July 2019 as

"OPIOID AWARENESS MONTH"

and the "Flagler Countywide Opioid Task Force" is recognized as playing a necessary function in the opioid crisis and urge all citizens, interest groups, and affected persons to join us in promoting the awareness and prevention of the opioid crisis in our community during the month of July and to take an active role in the fight to end opioid addiction and overdose.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM COAST, FLORIDA, APPROVING A PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH VEOLIA WATER TECHNOLOGIES, INC. FOR THE KRUGER HYDOTECH DISCFILTER CAPACITY UPGRADES; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE SAID AGREEMENTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR IMPLEMENTING ACTIONS AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Veolia Water Technologies Inc. has expressed a desire to provide Kruger Hydrotech Discfilter capacity upgrades to the City of Palm Coast; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Palm Coast desires to purchase the above referenced Kruger Hydrotech Discfilter capacity upgrades from Veolia Water Technologies, Inc.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM COAST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. APPROVAL OF PURCHASE AGREEMENT. The City Council of the City of Palm Coast hereby approves the terms and conditions of a purchase agreement with Veolia Water Technologies, Inc. for the purchase of Kruger Hydrotech Discfilter capacity upgrades, as attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A."

SECTION 2. AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE. The City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute the necessary documents.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any section or portion of a section of this Resolution proves to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional, it shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force, or effect of any other section or part of this Resolution.

SECTION 4. CONFLICTS. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with any of the provisions of this Resolution are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. IMPLEMENTING ACTIONS. The City Manager is hereby authorized to take any actions necessary to implement the action taken in this Resolution.

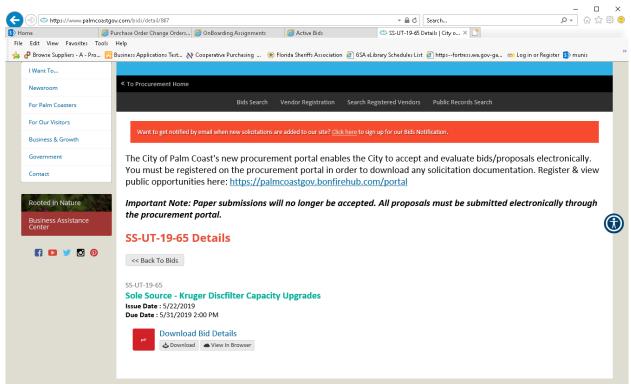
