2 MONARCH BUTTERFLY AND OTHER POLLINATORS

Mr. Podduturu M. Reddy gave a presentation which is attached to these minutes.

Members of the public asked various questions about the habits of the Monarch butterflies, including how far south they fly, where does one purchase milkweed, etc. Mr. Reddy provided answers to these questions.

Chair Seib informed the BEAC members and the members of the public about the BEAC's previous discussion regarding the City of Palm Coast becoming a Monarch Butterfly City. Ms. Dawson clarified that the next steps involve taking a landscape plan to the City's Parks' Team to have them review and approve the plan. Ms. Dawson clarified some suggestions on the plan for pricing of and proposed materials to be used. Ms. Dawson clarified the choice of location for the Monarch garden was ammended to be at the Turtle sculpture at Hollard Park (near the Historical Society building). Ms. Dawson clarified that she intends to discuss with the Parks' Team about the need for irrigation in this location.

Ms. Dawson also mentioned a second location at the rain garden behind City Hall. A discussion ensued about the limited City Staff that is available to establish and maintained these gardens.

Chair Seib will work with Mr. Reddy on a Monarch Butterfly Plan and have it ready for the BEAC's January 2020 meeting. Ms. Dawson will send a plan for the existing rain garden at City Hall for the BEAC members to have an idea of the dimensions of the proposed garden area.


Freshwater Canal Pollution

- 58 miles of freshwater canals in PC
- Homes bordering canals are premium waterfront lots

Freshwater canal lot facts

- The area bordering the canal is not part of the homeowners property
- This land is an easement owned by the City

Canal lots showing property lines and city easement



Canal Lot Information

- At present, the easement area is not cleared in any initial lot clearing by the home builder
- Apparently, the homeowner can remove all vegetation on this easement except for any larger trees
- The homeowner then sods this easement area and it becomes part of their backyard

Pollution Sources in Our Freshwater Canals

- Sewerage leaking from older pipes runoff
- Trash deposited along roadsides
- Pesticides from yard and swale/ditch spraying
- Lawn mowing and yard waste
- Yard lawn fertilizer runoff

Canal Mostly Clear of Algal Growth



Pollution Progression

- When pesticide runoff enters the canals it has the same effect as on land in that bugs, aquatic life is killed and decomposes on the canal bed
- Yard waste such as grass clippings also dies and adds to a muck/sediment bed
- Fertilizer runoff stimulates green plants like algae that overgrow while using up all the fertilizer then die and remove oxygen from the canal














Possible Solutions to Nutrient Overload

- Identify an area that the homeowner cannot clear of the city easement property adjacent to the canal
- The simplest area would be thw slope down to the canal waters edge





Proposal

 City code that all freshwater canal waterfront lots leave the slope of the canal uncleared to reduce or prevent yard wastes, pesticides and fertilizers from entering the canal
