- 11.1. Continue partnerships with local organizations to identify and assist in programs and activities implementation

Since 2002, the City of Palm Coast has hosted the Cultural Art Financial Assistance Matching Grant to support Flagler County's history, arts, and culture organizations that hold events and programs within city limits. This initiative enhances the quality of life for residents and visitors and bolsters the City's reputation as an innovative cultural center.

In 2022, the Flagler County Board of County Commissioners designated the Flagler County Cultural Council (FC3) as the countywide Arts Council, also known as a Local Arts Agency. FC3 serves as an umbrella organization fostering arts, history, and culture throughout Flagler County.

In 2024, The City of Palm Coast partnered with FC3 to administer the Cultural Art Grant program

For Fiscal Year 2025-2026, 8 applications were submitted for review. An FC3 committee evaluated each application to ensure it met the grant's eligibility criteria. The organizations listed in the attached PowerPoint have requested funding to support history, arts, and cultural programs and/or events in Palm Coast.

Background:

On May 13, 2025, City Council directed staff to implement a Backyard Chicken Pilot Program. The portal for applying for backyard chickens under the Pilot Program permits was available on June 18, 2025.

City Council requested staff present the results of the pilot program to City Council. Staff will present the results and challenges encountered during the pilot program, and request direction on next steps for backyard chickens.

The attached draft Ordinance is for Council's consideration to allow backyard chickens. The allowance of backyard chickens would require an amendment to the City's *Code of Ordinances* adding a new section for backyard chickens and an amendment to the Glossary for the "Farm Animals" definition to exclude "chickens" in the *Unified Land Development Code*.

UPDATED BACKGROUND FROM THE SEPTEMBER 23, 2025, WORKSHOP MEETING:

At the September 23, 2025, City Council Workshop, Council reviewed the status of the 12 applicants and narrowed the list to 6.

Council provided direction for the applicants to submit a 2-page white paper discussing the first year of the City under their term, for staff to perform background and social media checks, and for the following schedule:

- October 8 All information due to HR
- October 9 All information due to Council
- October 14 Workshop Council discussion to select finalists
- November 13 Special Workshop Finalist interviews

ORIGINAL BACKGROUND FROM THE SEPTEMBER 23, 2025, WORKSHOP MEETING:

At the City Council Workshop on September 9, 2025, the Council reviewed the applicant pool for the City Manager position. Out of 112 applicants, the Council narrowed the list down to the top 12 candidates. Each Council Member submitted two interview questions, which the selected candidates were asked to answer in recorded video interviews.

Direction Needed:

- 1. Scoring and Selection of Semi-Finalists
 - Narrow list from 12 to top 5 -8
- 2. Interview Techniques for Final Candidate Selection
 - Council to discuss and provided direction on interview methods, which may include:
 - Structured panel interviews
 - o Community or stakeholder meet-and-greet sessions
 - o One-on-one interviews with individual Council Members
