2. PRESENTATION - PARKS & RECREATION DEPARTMENT FISCAL YEAR 2026 QUARTER 3 REPORT

Facilitator Brittany McDermott presented the topic to the Board.

The Board discussed the department's third-quarter (Q3) summary, including year-to-date KPI progress and updates from the Explore, Connect, and Play sections. Topics included Parks Maintenance Level of Service, Enhancing our Community, Making Progress in Our Community, Connecting our Community, Partnering with our Community, Engaging with our Community – Testimonials, Providing for our Community, the Palm Coast Community Center, the Southern Recreation Center/Athletics, Palm Coast Aquatics Center, Palm Harbor Golf Club, and Awards and Achievements.

During the Parks & Recreation Department Fiscal Year 2026 Quarter 3 Report Presentation, around 4:45 p.m., Board Member Lightfoot departed. A quorum remained present for the duration of the meeting.
